RESOLUTION #: 152-12

Board Action: Motion by Councilman Paschkes, seconded by Councilman Lyman, all voting aye on the following:

RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby acknowledge/correct/accept minutes of July 12, 2012 regular meeting of the Town Board and Work Session minutes of July 25, 2012.

NEW BUSINESS:

• Pound Ridge Fire District-requesting to use Highway garage property for training purposes on August 20 and 27th

The Board of Commissioners of the Fire Department is requesting permission to use the Highway Garage property for the purpose of training on August 20 and 27, 2012. Councilman Paschkes asked if the Town should have a certificate of insurance from the Fire District for using our facilities. Counsel Sullivan explained that the Town's insurance covers this.

RESOLUTION #: 153-12

Board Action: Motion by Councilman Lyman, seconded by Councilman Paschkes, all voting aye on the following:

RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby grants permission to the Board of Commissioners of the Fire Department to use the Highway Garage property for the purpose of training on August 20th and August 27, 2012 subject to confirmation that the Fire Department has the appropriate insurance coverage to protect the Town for this activity.

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• <u>Assessor-requesting authorization to attend annual Assessment Administration</u> Seminar

RESOLUTION #: 154-12

Board Action: Motion by Councilman Paschkes, seconded by Councilwoman Boak, all voting aye on the following:

RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby authorizes Carole Long, Assessor, to attend the annual NYS Assessors' Association conference in Lake Placid, NY on September 30 to October 3, 2012. Expenses for lodging, meals, tuition and travel are not to exceed \$1,200, the majority of which is reimbursable by NYS Office of Real Property Tax Services.

Pool Repairs & Resurfacing-consider approval of Consulting Engineers Agreement

The Town Board received a proposal from Maurice Wrangell, ASLA for the resurfacing of the three Town Pools. This will be done in two phases. The first phase will include the repairs to be done in the winter months. The extent of the repairs is not known until the top section where the steel meets the concrete is taken off. There will be replacement of existing white plaster finish with new, repair/replacement of defective tile work and possible repairs and restoration of selected pool joints. Phase two will be the actual resurfacing of the pools. Under the agreement, there is a paragraph that has "additional services" provided as requested charged at \$210.00 per hour in addition to the fixed fee of \$15,000 in proposal. The agreement has been reviewed by John Ritzcovan, Chair of Recreation Commission, and the Commission recommends signing the agreement.

Supervisor Warshauer had two things to clarify on this agreement:

- 1) The bidding is done in such a way that the bids come back with each of the pools being resurfaced separately. The Town Board would have the option to accept doing 1 or 2 pools the first year and the 3rd pool being done the next year. The bids would be submitted on an individual pool basis like unit pricing so the Town would have the option of resurfacing 1, 2 or 3 pools. Mr. Wrangell said that this could be done without additional cost to the Town.
- 2) Mr. Wrangell limits the number of inspections during construction to 4 and Supervisor Warshauer felt that the number of inspections should be increased. The maintenance portion of the project will be done in the fall and the actual resurfacing would be done in the spring.

Counsel Sullivan said that because the Building Department doesn't get involved in the project, he would suggest getting six (6) inspections because there won't be any other professional back up with this project. The inspections are basically progress reports versus quality of work reports. There may be a need for a construction supervisor to oversee that the job is being done according to the contract. Before the bids go out to the contractors, the Town Board will review the package assuring the job is done right.

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RESOLUTION #: 155-12

<u>Board Action:</u> Motion by Councilman Paschkes, seconded by Councilman Lyman, all voting aye on the following:

RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby authorizes the Supervisor to execute the Pool House Consultant Engineer Agreement with the additional items to be clarified inserted as discussed and subject to Town Attorney's review.

• Town House well – consider approval of Consulting Engineers Agreement

Councilman Lyman disclosed that Kellard Session Consulting, P.C. does work for his boss at the Pound Ridge Golf Club. He explained that the Town House requires a water treatment facility for the existing water supply pursuant to a letter from the Westchester County Department of Health, dated December 8, 2011. This determination was made based on the supply wells location in relationship to the pond behind the Town House. Kellard Sessions Consulting, P.C. has given the Town Board a proposal to provide professional engineering services regarding the design and permitting of such a facility. The Health Department outlined three (3) options to follow, two (2) include lengthy and extensive testing while the third is the acceptance of the determination and the installation of a treatment facility. The Town has decided to install the required treatment system which will include a chlorination feed, retention tanks, filters, ultra-violet light and a new pressure tank. The design phase will be \$7,500; the permitting will cost \$2,500 and the construction phase will be \$3,000 totaling \$13,000.00. This does not include the cost of equipment.

RESOLULTION #: 156-12

This will be taken from Building Maintenance Fund that has been set aside.
