Councilwoman Sullivan has some question as to who will be paying for the maintenance of the street lamps in the Parking District should replacement of lights or technical maintenance be needed. She wasn't sure if it falls under the Parking District, Pound Ridge Partnership or the Town Board. Deputy Supervisor Ali Boak suggested inviting Jim Best to our Town Board meeting on February 14, 2019 to discuss this because he is actively involved with NYSEG on this project of replacement lamps in the Parking District.

• Westchester Power: CCA Electric Service Agreement 2019

Daniel Welsh, Sustainable Westchester, gave an update on the Westchester Power-CCA Electric Service Agreement which is a community bulk electricity purchasing program which replaces the utility as default. Westchester Power serves about 100,000 customers

overall and approximately 12,000 of those in the NYSEG territory. Overall, \$1 million saved, 357 million kilowatt-hours served, 43,409 tons of carbon dioxide avoided. It is time for the municipalities to sign the Memo of Understanding (MOU) between

Sustainable Westchester, Inc. and the Town of Pound Ridge undertaking a Community Choice Aggregation.

Daniel Welsh went through a PowerPoint demonstration showing charts explaining pure energy savings and exemption from some portion of sales tax on the delivery portion of their bill and the avoidance of a billing issuance charge of \$0.89/month billing charge. He also mentioned that this program allows an opt-out option. He also mentioned that anyone in Pound Ridge who has day/night meters will not be able to join in the program at this time; only fixed meters will be part of the program. The program gives the best price with 100% hydropower.
