CALL TO ORDER: Supervisor Hansan called the meeting to order at 8:00 pm.

CALL FOR EXECUTIVE SESSION:

Board Action: Motion by Councilperson Boak, seconded by Councilperson Briggs, all voting aye, to hold an Executive Session on Tuesday, February 4, 2020, at 7:00 pm, to discuss personnel matters.

Board Action: Motion by Councilperson Paschkes, seconded by Councilperson Briggs, all voting aye to accept the minutes of the Town Board Meeting held on January 7, 2020. **NEW BUSINESS:**

• Westchester County Planning Department: Presentation from Norma Drummond on Census 2020

Norma Drummond, Commissioner of the Westchester County Department of Planning, discussed the 2020 Census. For the first time ever this year, most census data will be collected digitally. Beginning in March, households will receive a code via traditional mail that they can use to respond to census questions on a computer or other digital device or by making a telephone call. A small percentage of households will be visited by census workers.

• Fire District: Presentation from Fire District Commissioner Peter Gallagher

Commissioner Peter Gallagher described the structure of the Fire District, the services it provides, and the issues it faces. Current challenges include the difficulty of attracting volunteers in the 31-45 age range (most are either older or younger), the need to provide subsidized housing near the firehouse, the lack of readily available water for fighting fires, and limited storage space in the existing building. Unfortunately, it has been determined that the 77 Westchester property is not currently suitable for addressing storage and housing needs.

• Deer Management

The deer management presentation was postponed until the February 11, 2020, Town Board meeting.

• Sustainable Westchester: Presentation from Nina Orville on Community Solar

Nina Orville, Director of Community Programs for Sustainable Westchester, made a presentation on the new Community Solar program. Unlike the earlier Solarize Westchester program, Community Solar involves off-site solar panel installations, is available to almost all customers, and results in guaranteed lower electric costs.

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• Conservation Board

a. Introduction of New Junior Associate

Carrie Sears, chair of the Conservation Board, introduced a new Conservation Board Junior Associate, Riley Hester. Riley is working on a project to increase local opportunities for recycling postconsumer products and to increase awareness about existing recycling opportunities. The project entails placing collection boxes around town and will eventually include a map and a website as well.

b. Update on completed DEC Forestry Grant and Tree City Recertification

Carrie Sears reported that the Town has submitted a grant proposal for \$38,000 to inventory trees in the Town Park, at the Town House, and along the walking path. Awards will be announced in March. Also, the Town has been recertified as a Tree City.

c. Update on Tree Risk Assessment

Carrie Sears also provided an update on Tree Risk Assessment. The Town's contracted service provider for tree removal is not certified to identify risk, and the DEC forester can provide only limited guidance, so it will likely be necessary to put the project out to bid.

Councilperson Paschkes suggested that the Town may be able to partner with Aquarion to share the costs. Councilperson Boak suggested that the job may be so large that it would be necessary to segment the assessment or create a multi-year plan. Town Attorney Bill Harrington pointed out that regardless of how the project is structured, the Town would of course respond in a timely manner to identified risk.

Carrie Sears will work with Nicole Engel and Steve Conti to develop an RFP. After consulting with the DEC forester and Bill Harrington, they will present the RFP to the Town Board.

d. Natural Resources Inventory

Carrie Sears reported that the Natural Resources Inventory has been updated. The updated version will soon be uploaded to the Conservation Board web page.

Consequently, Leslie and Thomas Hunt have agreed to sell gravesite 209-1 to Alan Walker so that he can be buried there. The Hunts will reserve gravesite 209-2 for themselves.
