# I. CALL TO ORDER OF REGULAR MEETING

#### V. NEW BUSINESS

A. Councilperson Briggs – Acceptance of sculpture RESOLUTION 33-22

# B. Bedford Central School District – Presentation on potential bond referendum

Bedford Central School District Board Member Rob Mazurek discussed plans for a potential bond referendum in May 2022. The school board has commissioned a master plan that includes infrastructure repair and improvements, as well as new designs at the middle school and high school, with a total cost of \$107 million. The goal is to identify projects in the master plan totaling approximately \$70 million to be financed by the bond and to defer the remaining projects for future consideration. A \$70 million bond would not impact the district tax levy.

# C. CityScape Consultants – Presentation on poll results and zoning

Susan Rabold, of CityScape Consultants, discussed Pound Ridge residents' responses to a recent wireless telecommunications poll. The overwhelming majority wanted better service, and a surprising 67.5% of respondents work as well as live in Pound Ridge, suggesting that the number of weekenders has declined and that many more residents are now working from home. Ms. Rabold also discussed a map showing previously identified sites for possible installations, as well as elements of the zoning code that could present barriers to achieving optimal coverage.
