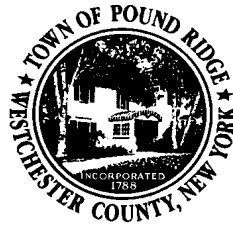

SUBJECT: NYS CHANGE IN LAW AFFECTING VIETNAM VETERANS

Request to adopt Recent Change to Dates of Service for Veterans of Vietnam:

On November 11, 2021, Governor Hochul signed into law bill A.7388B/S.7124. The intention of the bill was to update the service dates for Vietnam veterans to coincide with the newly enacted federal law (H.R. 7105).

Under the new law, active dates have been extended to now include November 1, 1955 to May 7, 1975. Full details of the bill are attached.

This change in Law would change the dates available to Vietnam Veterans enabling an approximate 6 years of time to qualify for the exemption. A change in the commencement date of the Vietnam war from 12/22/61 to 11/1/55, provides a larger window of time for exemption qualification.

AN ACT to amend the real property tax law, the executive law, the education law, the public health law, the civil service law, the public officers law, the public housing law and the social services law, in relation to conforming the definition of a veteran serving in the Vietnam war era to newly enacted federal law (H.R. 7105) for veterans who served in-country in the Republic of Vietnam from between February 28, 1961 and May 7, 1975, to any active duty service in the Republic of Vietnam that occurred between November 1, 1955 and May 7, 1975

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Paragraph (a) of subdivision 1 of section 458-a of the
2 real property tax law, as amended by chapter 179 of the laws of 2006, is
3 amended to read as follows:
4 (a) "Period of war" means the Spanish-American war; the Mexican border
5 period; World War I; World War II; the hostilities, known as the Korean
6 war, which commenced June twenty-seventh, nineteen hundred fifty and
7 terminated on January thirty-first, nineteen hundred fifty-five; the
8 hostilities, known as the Vietnam war, which commenced [~~February twen-~~
9 ~~ty-eighth, nineteen hundred sixty-one~~] November first, nineteen hundred
10 fifty-five and terminated on May seventh, nineteen hundred seventy-five;
11 and the hostilities, known as the Persian Gulf conflict, which commenced
12 August second, nineteen hundred ninety.

19 china at any time from the [~~twenty-second day of December, nineteen~~
20 ~~hundred sixty-one~~] first day of November, nineteen hundred fifty-five,
21 to and including the seventh day of May, nineteen hundred seventy-five
22 and (a) was honorably discharged from the armed forces of the United
23 States, or (b) has a qualifying condition, as defined in section three
24 hundred fifty of the executive law, and has received a discharge other
25 than bad conduct or dishonorable from the armed forces of the United
26 States, or (c) is a discharged LGBT veteran, as defined in section three
27 hundred fifty of the executive law, and has received a discharge other
28 than bad conduct or dishonorable from the armed forces of the United
29 States; "born with Spina Bifida" shall mean a diagnosis at birth of such

8 § 8. Section 63 of the public officers law, as amended by chapter 490

16 in this state, and of the head of every department, bureau and office in
17 the government of the various cities and villages in this state, and the
18 officers of any public benefit corporation or any public authority of

47 or monthly basis, with or without maintenance, shall also be entitled to
48 leave of absence with pay under the provisions of this section and no
49 deduction in vacation allowance or budgetary allowable number of working
50 days shall be made in lieu thereof. A refusal to give such leave of
51 absence to one entitled thereto shall be neglect of duty.

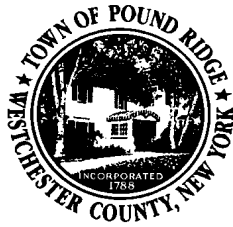

SUBJECT: REMOVING TEMPORARY EXEMPTION FROM TOWN OWNED PROPERTIES

9456-37.11 and 9031-222, known as Barnegat Road and White Birch Road respectively, currently assessed with a 33551 exemption which provides for limited school tax and no town or county tax, are in their 3rd and final year of this exemption.

This exemption will be removed on the 2022 Roll and both properties will return to taxable status for 2023 tax year. If they are designated for public use prior to Taxable Status date, May 1, 2022, they will be tax exempt starting on the 2022 Roll.

9454-9 aka 77 Westchester Avenue is now tax exempt.

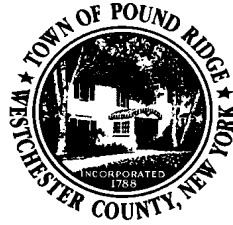

SUBJECT: NYS EXECUTIVE ORDER RE: AGED ALL EXEMPTION 2022

Requesting review of the governor's executive order to rescind renewal requirements for RP 467 of the Real Property Tax Law on the 2022 Roll, Aged All Exemption, per attached copy of Executive Order, 2nd bullet point, requiring a resolution by the Town Board to implement.

A similar Executive Order was implemented and a resolution passed for the 2020 Roll in Pound Ridge.

Typically, reminder letters to the Seniors go out in January so they have time to fill out the applications, get their 2021 taxes prepared and/or supply me with the 1099's necessary to process their application, all of which is due no later than May 1, 2022.

A yes vote on this resolution will still require an informational letter to be sent to the Senior Aged All recipients ASAP.

EXECUTIVE ORDER

Declaring a Disaster Emergency in the State of New York

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 global pandemic has been declared a Public Health Emergency of International Concern by the World Health Organization since early 2020;

WHEREAS, the United States Health and Human Services Secretary declared a public health emergency for the entire United States to aid the nation's healthcare community in responding to COVID-19 on January 31, 2020;

WHEREAS, New York is now experiencing COVID-19 transmission at rates the State has not seen since April 2021;

WHEREAS, the rate of new COVID-19 hospital admissions has been increasing over the past month to over 300 new admissions a day;

WHEREAS, the state must pursue a coordinated approach to ensure hospital capacity statewide is able to meet regional needs;

WHEREAS, the State government must support the municipalities and counties in their efforts to facilitate and administer vaccinations and tests for COVID-19, and to prevent the virus from continuing to spread at such rates;

WHEREAS, a new SarCoV2 variant, known as Omicron, has been identified and named a variant of concern by the World Health Organization and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention;

WHEREAS, this variant has been identified in all 50 U.S. states, including New York, and more than 104 countries;

WHEREAS, this Omicron variant has been shown to be highly transmissible and may cause exponential spread;

WHEREAS, current vaccinations do not appear to be as effective against Omicron infection, while remaining stronger against severe disease;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kathy Hochul, Governor of the State of New York, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution of the State of New York and Section 28 of Article 2-B of the Executive Law, do hereby continue the terms, conditions, and suspensions contained in Executive Order 11 until January 25, 2022.

IN ADDITION, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Section 29-a of Article 2-B of the Executive Law to temporarily suspend or modify any statute, local law, ordinance, order, rule, or regulation, or parts thereof, of any agency during a State disaster emergency, if compliance with such statute, local law, ordinance, order, rule, or regulation would prevent, hinder, or delay action necessary to cope with the disaster emergency or if necessary to assist or aid in coping with such disaster, I hereby temporarily suspend or modify, for the period from the date of this Executive Order through January 25, 2022 the following:

- Title V of Article 5 of the Public Health Law and subparts 19 and 58 of Title 10 of the NYCRR, to the extent necessary to allow laboratories holding a Clinical Laboratory Improvement Acts (CLIA) certificate and meeting the CLIA quality standards described in 42 CFR Subparts H, J, K and M, to perform testing for the detection of SARS-CoV-2 in specimens collected from individuals in New York State;
- Subdivisions 7, 7-a and 8 of section 459-c of the Real Property Tax Law, and subdivisions 5, 5-a, 5-b, 5-c and 6 of section 467 of the Real Property Tax Law, to the extent necessary to permit the governing body of an assessing unit to adopt a resolution directing the assessor to grant exemptions pursuant to such section on the 2022 assessment roll to all property owners who received that exemption on the 2021 assessment roll, thereby dispensing with the need for renewal applications from such persons, and further dispensing with the requirement for assessors to mail renewal applications to such persons. Provided however, that the governing body may, at its option, include in such resolution procedures by which the assessor may require a renewal application to be filed when he or she has reason to believe that an owner who qualified for the exemption on the 2021 assessment roll may have since changed his or her primary residence, added another owner to the deed, transferred the property to a new owner, or died;
- Article 7 of the Public Officers Law to the extent necessary to authorize the New York State Senate and Assembly, at their discretion, to meet and take such action authorized by law remotely by conference call or similar service and otherwise act in conformance with the provisions of Part E of Chapter 417 of the Laws of 2021, and expiring upon the expiration of such Chapter.
