In response to your request, please find the following internship description:

Pound Ridge Land Conservancy is seeking two Preserve Steward Interns for the 2023 Summer season to assist in a variety of stewardship and management duties on PRLC preserves throughout Pound Ridge. Interns will receive broad training on land management practices, skills and equipment. Under the supervision of PRLC's Land Steward, intern duties may include preserve monitoring, trail maintenance and construction, performing boundary, sign, and kiosk maintenance, invasive species control and ecological restoration, ecological monitoring and research, educational programming, and public outreach activities. Specific duties vary yearly based on the needs of the organization and interests of interns. Each intern will take the lead in planning and executing a project related to their work with PRLC. Through this project, the successful applicant will be able to tailor this internship program to their specific interest or degree concentration, consistent with PRLC mission and goals. This is a 10-week part-time (20 hours/week) paid internship.

Kevin, Dan —

The Landmarks and Historic District Commission seeks the town's support of a collaborative project to be undertaken with the Pound Ridge Historical Society.

Over the last year, the commission has worked to strengthen ties with PRHS, an invaluable resource for our commission's work. Last summer, PRHS invited the commission to consider updates to the Landmarks panel displayed at the Pound Ridge Museum.

In the course of those discussions, we hit on a new idea — to create an interpretive panel to be displayed outside the museum's entrance for the purpose of helping visitors better understand the historic significance of the visible buildings in the hamlet. As a reminder, the hamlet is a Historic District and nearly all of its structures are Landmarks.

As discussions evolved, Commission member Gina Federico volunteered to design the panel and has created a design that incorporates graphic and textual elements from Pound Ridge Landmarks signage — and the newer signage in Scotts Corners.

The Commission believes this panel is an important signal of our community's ongoing interest in preserving the community's rich character and history.

PRHS is now actively fundraising for the interpretive sign — a major fundraiser, a house tour of historic homes that includes several Landmarks, was to be held April 30 — the budget for which is outlined below:

Sign: \$2,400 Delivery: \$360 Installation: \$650 Landscaping: ~\$500

Additional details on the budget and a rendering of the sign are attached.

The Commission humbly requests that the town, on behalf of the Commission, fund \$2,500 for the project, which we believe aligns with our mission "to preserve the qualities of ... visible landmarked and historic buildings so that residents and visitors alike can cherish the character for which Pound Ridge is known."

As a reminder, while the Commission is apportioned a small budget each year, we have not spent much of that money — if any — in the last three years.

I would be happy to address any questions or concerns and thank you in advance for your

consideration of this request.


The Hamlet

Historic District of Pound Ridge New York

Pound Ridge Historic District – known as The Hamlet – was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1985. The district contains 46 historic buildings and encompasses almost all of the hamlet. The majority of the buildings in the district date between 1780 and 1852. The earliest building was built in 1758 and is the Capt. Joseph Lockwood House.

The Pound Ridge Historic District is a rare example of a rural hamlet which retains architectural and spatial characteristics and historical associations illustrating family and community life patterns in eastern Westchester County in the late eighteenth and nineteenth centuries.

On July 2, 1779 Pound Ridge was the scene of a dramatic raid by Lt. Col. Banastre Tarleton as part of a larger effort to dislodge Washington from the vicinity of New York. Tarleton's objectives were to find and capture Major Ebenezer Lockwood, member of the Westchester County Militia and Committee of Safety, and delegate to the New York Provincial Congress, Col. Elsiha Sheldon whose "Enemy's Cavalry" was charged with defending the frontier against British and Tory incursions, headquartered in Captain Lockwood's home, and Benjamin Tallmadge, leader of the Culper Ring, the spy network working for General Washington in the New York area. His attemptsthwarted, Tarleton ordered Major Ebenezer Lockwood's house and the Presbyterian church, where cavalry horses had been picketed, to be burned. American reinforcements arrived, fought back, and Tarleton retreated.




